Greensboro Four

The Common Experience will feature the documentary "February One" in the Recital Hall at the Ogle Center Feb. 7 from 7:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. followed by a group discussion. The film is about four men who became known as The Greensboro Four.

The Four became prominent figures in the American Civil Rights Movement by having a sit-in at a Woolworth's lunch counter in Greensboro, N.C. in 1960 where they were refused service.
