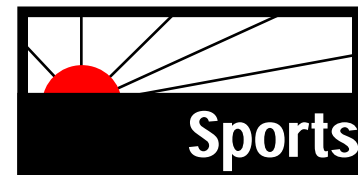

The exhibit is an essay of 49 photos taken in the Darfur region of Sudan, and will be on display through March 31.

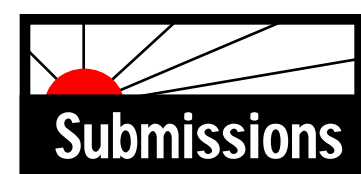
Admission is free but visitors must check in at the Admissions Desk.
